GENERAL EDS

All courses highlighted in blue are general education courses and are offered in a variety of different formats. They could be fully online, blended, or in-person. These classes are suggested to be completed prior to program start. Most of these courses are also offered at all regional center locations or campuses.

NURSING CORE THEORY CLASSES

All courses highlighted in yellow are only offered in-person in blended format. These classes are only day hours and will be two days per week.

CLINICAL COURSES

All courses highlighted in red are clinical courses. Students will be placed in a day clinical.

Clinical courses may be six to eight hour shifts and will be two days per week. Students typically need to set time aside to complete clinical paperwork. Clinicals may start at 6:00 A.M. for a dayshift.

Semester One - Long Term Care Facility: This clinical will be eight weeks and held on Thursday and Friday. It will be a day clinical.

Semester Two - Clinic and Med/Surg: The clinic clinical will be day hours and occur Monday through Friday and med/surg clinical will be day hours on Tuesday and Wednesday.



SKILLS COURSES

All courses highlighted in green are in person. Students are required to practice outside of scheduled class time and are assigned to a check-off time. Check-off times are scheduled outside of class and required of all students.

GRADE REQUIREMENTS

No final grade lower than a “B” is acceptable in the nursing or natural science courses marked with an asterisk. A student must repeat the course with “B” or better final grade to continue in or graduate from this program. If the course is sequential, the successful retake must occur before continuing the sequence.
