GENERAL EDS

All courses highlighted in **blue** are general education courses and are offered in a variety of different formats. They could be fully online, web conference, blended, or in-person. These classes are suggested to be completed prior to program start. Most of these courses are also offered at all regional center locations or campuses.

NURSING CORE THEORY CLASSES

The courses highlighted in **yellow** are offered online or in-person. The in-person classes will be offered during the day. There will not be the option for evening theory classes if taken in person.

CLINICAL COURSES

All courses highlighted in **red** are clinical courses. Students are asked preference of day or evening, but it is not a guarantee that students will receive their preference. Clinical courses may be six to eight hour shifts and will be two days per week. Students typically need to set time aside the night before or morning of clinical to complete clinical paperwork. Clinicals may start at 6am for a day shift or 2pm for an evening shift.

Semester One - Long Term Care Facility: Long Term Care Facility: this clinical will only be the second eight-week session and held on Thursday and Friday. Clinical may be day or evening.

Semester Two - OB, Community, and Med/Surg; There will be a clinical each eight-week session and held on Thursday and Friday. Clinical may be day or evening.

Semester Three - Eight weeks of med/surg, four weeks of psych and four weeks off. This clinical will be held on Tuesday and Wednesday. Clinical may be day or evening.

Semester Four - Eight weeks of med/surg, four weeks of simulations: All students go to med/surg the first eight weeks of the semester, and it will be held on Thursday and Friday. Clinical may be day or evening. Simulations will occur after completion of med/surg during the second eight weeks of the semester. Transitions is a 90-hour precepted clinical that will be completed over four weeks and will not overlap with simulations or med/surg clinical rotations. Students will work the hours of the nurse preceptor.



SKILLS COURSES

All courses highlighted in green are in-person. Students are required to practice outside of scheduled class time and are assigned a check-off time. Check-off times are scheduled outside of class and required of all students.

Semester One - morning or afternoon sections available and will be one day per week.

Semester Three - morning or afternoon sections available and will be one day per week.

GRADE REQUIREMENTS

No final grade lower than a "B" is acceptable in the nursing or natural science courses marked with an asterisk. A student must repeat the course with "B" or better final grade to continue in or graduate from this program. If the course is sequential, the successful retake must occur before continuing the sequence.
