The **Infant Toddler Certificate** is designed for family child care providers, infant toddler teachers, child care administrators, directors, B-3 aides/teachers, certified providers, and anyone considering entering early childhood care and education who is looking to gain specialized knowledge and tools to nurture the development of children in the first three years of life. Completion of the four courses in this credential, along with preparation of a portfolio, permits the student to apply for and attain the Wisconsin Infant Toddler Professional Credential from The Registry.

Requirements for Certificate Entry:

- This certificate is designed for individuals currently working with infants and toddlers, or those who wish to specialize in working with infants or toddlers.
- This certificate is a compilation of four courses which address the many roles, skills and issues needed to effectively nurture the development of infants and toddlers.
- T.E.A.C.H. scholarships are available to complete these Infant Toddler Certificate courses.
- It is recommended that courses be taken in order, but it is required that the Capstone course be taken last.

Certificate Completers Will Be Able To:

- Apply principles related to the care and education of children three and under.
- Care for infants and toddlers in group settings.
- Establish partnerships with parents and the community.

Curriculum

ECE: Infant /Toddler Development

Catalog # 10-307-151 3 Credits
Infant and toddler development in an early childhood education setting. Development of infants/toddlers; prenatal conditions and development; child development theories; heredity and the environment; culturally and developmentally appropriate environments.

Infant/Toddler-Group Care

Catalog # 10-307-113 3 Credits
Elements of quality, philosophical foundation, respect, relationships, culturally sensitive care, diversity in group care, brain development, assessment and planning in a variety of settings for young children.

ECE: Family/Community Relationships

Catalog # 10-307-195 3 Credits
Relationships with family/community in early childhood. Diversity and anti-bias perspectives in families and community; family patterns, trends, relationships; communication strategies; relationships with families; advocate for children/families; community resources.

Infant/Toddler-Credential Capstone

Catalog # 10-307-115 3 Credits
encompass and integrate the theory, practice, and reflections related to Courses 1, 2, 3. Supervised demonstration in the learner's own infant/toddler setting. Student portfolio development is required.

This course must be taken last.

Additional Options

The Infant Toddler Certificate courses may be taken as part of the Early Childhood Education Associate Degree. Two of the courses (Infant/Toddler Development and Family/Community Relationships) are part of the Associate Degree. Infant/Toddler-Group Care can be taken as an elective. Upon completion of the Infant/Toddler Credential, the Capstone course can be substituted for Practicum 2 in the Associate Degree. This means that in addition to earning an Associate Degree, you would also earn the Infant Toddler Credential.
