All Instructors are Wisconsin Department of Justice Certified and Force on Force Scenario and Safety Certified. Our instructors are experts in proper firearms safety and management techniques.

Who Should Attend this Training?

Any responsible adult who is committed to the safe handling and operation of a firearm. The content and concepts of this course do not endorse or oppose any political or personal views regarding firearm ownership. This training will provide the learner with up-to-date content in a safe and positive learning environment that will enable each learner to safely conduct maintenance procedures, load, reload, and unload the firearm, properly store the firearm and ammunition, and fire the firearm accurately. Training participants will develop a practical and reliable understanding of Wisconsin legal statutes regarding Self-Protection and Privilege in Use of Force.

Equipment Required

Attendees may bring the following:

- ◆ Approved firearms in 9 millimeter, .40 caliber, .45 caliber, .38 caliber, and .357 caliber. The weapon is subject to safety and function inspections conducted by NWTC Staff
- ◆ Ammunition must be approved, or is available for purchase through NWTC
- ◆ Protective equipment, such as eye and ear protection

Care and transportation of your firearm should be done so consistent with Wisconsin state law and the Department of Natural Resource Regulations. All firearms are prohibited on the NWTC main campus.

A supply of firearms and protective gear is available for a learner's usage for the purposes of Civilian Firearms training. This is an exciting opportunity for individuals who are interested in purchasing a firearm because they are able to experience the various types of equipment on the market.

Civilian Firearms Level I:

Skill Development and Safety

In this first course, learners will develop safe weapon-handling skills to include:

- ◆ Safe storage of the firearm and ammunition
- ◆ Safe loading, re-loading, and unloading skills
- ◆ Basic skills of firing a firearm, such as stance, grip, and trigger control
- ◆ Safe cleaning and maintenance
- ◆ Critical skills necessary for shooter safety including the development of performance and accuracy

Prerequisite: No Experience Required

Skill Maintenance

After the successful completion of the Civilian Firearms Level I course, attendees are eligible to receive a monthly electronic posting of open range dates and times hosted at NWTC using the indoor range. Open Range Sessions cost \$10 per session and allows for continued improvement of safety and skill development.

Civilian Firearms Level II:

Advanced Skill Development

During this 16 hour advanced secondary course, learners will:

- ◆ Review of core competencies learned in Civilian Firearms Level I
- ◆ Incorporate lateral movements while moving to cover
- ◆ Engage adversary targets from cover
- ◆ Engage a moving target while shooting from cover
- ◆ Learn flashlight usage techniques
- ◆ Test ability to react to an attacker using an interactive video simulator

Prerequisite: Successful completion of Civilian Firearms Level I



Civilian Firearms Level III:

Personal Safety Scenarios

The learner will develop “real life” skills in practical scenarios in the realistic environment of the NWTC Tactical House.

This 16 hour training is enhanced through the latest technology of the Force on Force marking cartridges and person safety equipment.

Prerequisite: Successful completion of Civilian Firearms Level I & II

Who Can Participate?

Requirements:

- ◆ Minimum of 18 years of age
- ◆ Successful completion of background check. (This fee is included in the course fee.)
