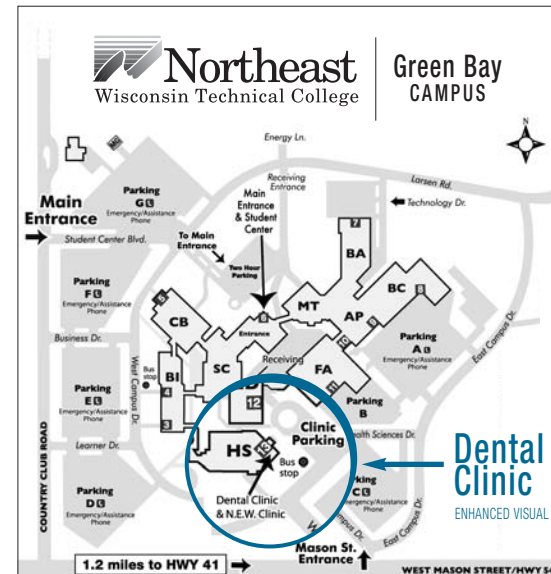
CLIENT RIGHTS

Clients seen at the NWTC Dental Clinic have a right to:

1. Respect of the individuality, dignity, and rights of every client regardless of race, color, creed, national origin, social, or economic status.
2. Professional, confidential client relationships.
3. The provision of services to the standard of care of the dental professions.
4. Protection and respect for personal and property rights of the client. Written permission is required to use client records for public presentation or educational purposes.
5. Compliance with OSHA requirements and CDC guidelines regarding exposure control for client and operator protections.
6. Provisions for client safety during treatment.
7. Thorough screening of client's medical background for any medical concerns that would contra-indicate or require modifications in preventive or restorative care.
8. Be informed of the uniqueness of the NWTC Dental Clinic as a learning environment and the impact on length of appointment, faculty supervision, and fees for service.
9. An explanation of recommended and alternative treatments, expected outcomes, and the option to refuse treatment.
10. Be informed of their current oral health status and be given appropriate referrals and recommendations.
11. Access to all clinical assessments and services including significant information related to an appointment.
12. The completion of service within the agreed upon time frame.

Northeast Wisconsin Technical College Dental Hygiene Clinic

Dental Hygiene students provide comprehensive dental hygiene services to adults and children under the supervision of a Dentist and Registered Dental Hygienist, who frequently evaluate the student's work to insure the client receives comprehensive care. Within this learning environment, clients may be required to return for several appointments in order to complete treatment.

PROCEDURES THAT MAY BE PROVIDED DURING AN APPOINTMENT:

- Head and neck examination
- Periodontal examination
- Restoration charting
- Plaque assessment
- Calculus (tartar) assessment
- Radiographs (x-rays)
- Treatment planning
- Cleaning
- Root planing/debridement
- Fluoride treatment
- Sensitivity treatment
- Sealants
- Nutritional counseling
- Tobacco cessation counseling
- Educational services

SCREENING APPOINTMENT:

Individuals interested in being seen in the Dental Hygiene Clinic may call (920) 498-5450 to be placed on a call list for a screening appointment. You will be contacted when an opening becomes available for a screening examination. Your name will remain on the call list until an appointment is scheduled or when two attempts have been made to schedule an appointment. A screening does not guarantee you will be accepted as client. If you are accepted as a client, you will be scheduled with a dental hygiene student.

Northeast Wisconsin Technical College Restorative Clinic

Restorative services are provided by a qualified dental team to adults and children living in the NWTC District, who are enrolled solely in the BadgerCare Standard Plan (Medicaid) with dental benefits. Dental hygiene services are available on a limited basis. Clients seen for restorative services may also be referred as appropriate to the Dental Hygiene Clinic to be seen by dental hygiene students.

The Restorative Clinic is funded through the Basic Needs Giving Partnership, including the Greater Green Bay Community Foundation, the US Oil Open fund for Basic Needs, the J.J. Keller Foundation, and Community Foundation donor partners.

PROCEDURES:

- Dental examination
- Radiographs (x-rays)
- Extractions
- Fillings
- Limited Endodontic treatment
- Emergency treatment

SCHEDULING AN APPOINTMENT:

Individuals interested in scheduling an appointment may call (920) 498-5450. At your first appointment a dentist will complete a dental examination with a full set of x-rays and establish a treatment plan according to your needs. The dentist will complete an assessment of hygiene needs and refer clients to be seen by the dental hygienist in the Restorative Clinic or a referral will be made to the Dental Hygiene Clinic call list.

HOURS OF OPERATION:

August through mid-May:
Monday, Wednesday, Thursday 8:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

If you must cancel an appointment, you are required to give at least 24 hours notice. Failure to notify the Clinic of cancellation, or failure to attend a scheduled appointment will result in removal from the call list for a period of one year.

The NWTC Dental Clinic will bill Medicaid for services provided. Co-pays may apply and are due on the date of service. Individuals that are not enrolled in Medicaid must pay for services rendered at the MA rate. Full payment is due at the time of service.

N.E.W. Community Clinic

The NWTC Dental Clinic partners with the N.E.W. Community Clinic to provide restorative dental services to the uninsured population while providing hands-on chair side experience for dental assistant students. The Clinic is staffed by volunteer community dentists that are assisted chair side by dental assistant students under the direction and supervision of NWTC Dental Assistant faculty.

PROCEDURES:

- Dental examination
- Radiographs (x-rays)
- Restorations (fillings)
- Extractions
- Partial and full dentures
- Limited endodontic (root canal) treatment

SCHEDULING AN APPOINTMENT:

Individuals interested in making an appointment should call the N.E.W. Community Clinic at (920) 437-9773. Individuals must be totally uninsured, at 125% of poverty level or less, and show proof of income to the N.E.W. Community Clinic before an appointment will be made at the NWTC Dental Clinic. Appointments are made according to a priority list based on the emergency of care needed.

General restorative services are provided free of cost. Fees for partial or full dentures range from \$150 - \$250.

Brown County Oral Health Partnership (OHP)

The Brown County Oral Health Partnership (OHP) is a non-profit organization that provides comprehensive preventive and restorative dental care to children in the Green Bay Public Schools. The OHP dental teams use portable equipment and travel throughout the school district providing oral healthcare from September through June. The OHP operates a clinic at the Howe Resource Center in Green Bay year-round, and during the summer months, uses the NWTC Dental Clinic as a site of operation. The NWTC Dental Clinic partners with the OHP to provide real-world learning opportunities for dental assistant and dental hygiene students and to maximize the outreach of services to children through various community organizations.
