Bi-Annual Pursuit Training 8:00am - 12:00pm <i>Attendees are asked to bring their agency vehicle.</i>	Fighting In and Around Cars - Advanced Vehicle Contacts 1:00pm - 5:00pm Require one force on force rounds.
 This is the LESB, state-mandated 2023-2025 biennial pursuit update required of all LEOs to maintain certification as in the State of Wisconsin; it will consist of the following components: Introduction: Review of legislative requirements, curriculum components, and pursuit data reporting. Vehicle Operations - Officer Survival: Safety belt use, speed management and multitasking, and intersection negotiation. Pursuit Operations: Pursuit defined, close pursuit, fresh pursuit, pursuit support, EVOC Disturbance Resolution Model, intervention options, pursuit termination factors, agency policy review (pursuit and corresponding Use of Force). Trending: Canine responsibilities in the new HRVC model. Application and Skills: Practical Driving Skills review, Use of Force Drills, HRVC Post Pursuit Simulations. 	As Policing is evolving rapidly, we as officers must prepare and train for the violent and deadly encounters taking place across the country. This four-hour course is geared towards officers who are looking to improve their tactical skills during traffic stops and other vehicle contacts situations. Officers will have an opportunity to evaluate and assess their skills through numerous high risk, ambush, and sudden assault situations. Officers will learn techniques: to shoot from the seated position, survive the sudden assault or ambush, and how to fight/move around vehicles during a gun fight. Course content will also include a dynamic look at the approach, the return, the re-approach, and non-approach considerations to improve officer safety.

 This 4-hour course is geared towards officers who are looking to refresh or learn new skills in team tactics and room clearing. Topics covered: 1,2,3 officer room entries Center Fed and Corner Fed Rooms Threshold evaluations Types of Doors Methodical vs Dynamic clears Team Movement Stairwells Metering or "slicing the Pie" Muzzle discipline Position SUL, Types of doorways Fatal Funnels Use of rifles Contact Cover Hallway movement 	The Handgun Refresher will allow officers to update their current skills and abilities through drills and discussions. Our focus will be to compliment the officer's current skill sets and allow them to assess and evaluate their current abilities through demonstrations and hands-on training exercises. Our focus will be on grip, posture, alignment, stance, steps of the draw, steps after combat shooting, phase 1 & 2 malfunctions, movement, out-of-battery reloads, in-battery reloads, use of cover, proper recovery, team tactics, and combat situations. The WI DOJ Handgun Qualification will also be completed for officers at the end of this training.

4-Hour Taser Recertification 8:00am - 12:00pm You will be required to bring your own two taser cartridges to be shot during the training as a requirement by Taser.	Active Shooter Response 1:00pm - 5:00pm Students will be required to bring one box of force on forces rounds to this training.
The 4-hour block will cover the annual taser recertification and will consist of the current material provided by Taser.	This course is geared towards officers who are looking to improve their tactical skills in Active Shooter Events and Mass Casualty Events when time is key. Officers will have an opportunity to evaluate and assess their skills through numerous scenarios and isolation exercises. This class is a hands-on class with force on force used to simulate active shooter situations to allows student to use the knowledge gained at the start of class to assess themselves.
