All courses highlighted in **blue** are general education courses and are offered in a variety of different formats. They could be online, blended, accelerated, correspondence or in person. These classes are suggested to be completed prior to program start. Most of these courses are also offered at all regional center locations or campuses.

All courses highlighted in **yellow** are either offered online or in person. They are offered on the weekend in person in the semester they are listed.

All courses highlighted in **green** are your Skills courses. These are only available in person. Please note for Skills classes, students need to set aside time to practice and check-off on their skill with an instructor in the lab.

All courses highlighted in **purple** are your clinical courses. Students typically need to set time aside the night or morning before to complete clinical paperwork.

Advanced Clinical is the only 8 hour/2 day per week clinical. All other clinical courses are 6 hour/2 day per week.

**Nursing Clinical Transition:** This clinical is a bit different from the rest, as it is a 90 hour precepted clinical. Students work the hours the Nurse Preceptor works and may finish the clinical at different times.

**IMPORTANT FINANCIAL AID NOTICE**

Students who complete all general education courses prior to starting the ADN Weekend program will have difficulties with financial aid eligibility. Financial aid requires that students enroll in at least 6 credits. If you have completed or will complete all general education courses prior to starting, please make sure to meet with your advisor to discuss your options.

**CURRICULUM NOTE**

No final grade lower than a 'B' is acceptable in the nursing or natural science courses marked with an asterisk. A student must repeat the particular course with "B" or better final grade to continue in or graduate from this program. If the course is sequential, the successful retake must occur before continuing the sequence.
