Meeting Minutes – May 7, 2012

The meeting was called to order at 2:30 p.m.

Roll Call was taken.

The minutes from April 16th meeting were approved as written; the motion to accept the minutes was made by Ballroom Dance Club and seconded by Dental Hygiene 2012.

Unfinished Business/Follow Ups

- Tim McNulty reported that Security raised \$1300 to go towards the NWTC Foundation. Along with some of the other departments at NWTC, the \$3000 total that was raised by various departments at NWTC will go towards the NWTC Foundation Scholarship.

New Business

- Ann Malvitz, NWTC Public Relations Specialist, and John Kopp, Director of Enterprise Applications, discussed the process of updating and revising the NWTC website. - Tim Derozier gave a report on the Almost Fre-Cycle event that was held at NWTC on Tuesday, April 17 to Thursday, April 19. The event raised \$594; the proceeds will go towards the NWTC Scholarship Fund, and will provide a scholarship to a NWTC Student at the August 2 Awards Banquet. Tim thanked all of the students who volunteered their time or donated items, and announced that next year's event will be held on April 23-25, 2012.

About 130 new appointments were scheduled each quarter, and it is estimated that about 2,000 total appointments will have been scheduled by the end of the fiscal year.
