GENERAL EDS

All courses highlighted in **blue** are general education courses and are offered in a variety of different formats. They could be fully online, web conference, blended, or in-person. These classes are suggested to be completed prior to program start. Most of these courses are also offered at all regional center locations or campuses.

NURSING CORE THEORY CLASSES

The courses highlighted in **yellow** are only offered in-person. These classes are only day hours and will be one or two days per week, depending on the semester. Semester one theory classes are one day per week and semester two theory classes are two days per week.

SKILLS COURSES

All courses highlighted in **green** are in-person. Students are required to practice outside of scheduled class time and are assigned a check-off time. Check-off times are scheduled outside of class and required of all students.

CLINICAL COURSES

All courses highlighted in **red** are clinical courses. Students are asked for preference of day or evening, but it is not guaranteed that students will receive their preference. Day shifts are most common at the Sturgeon Bay site. Clinical courses may be six-to-eight-hour shifts and will be two days per week. Students typically need to set time aside the night before or morning of clinical to complete clinical paperwork.

Intro to Clinical Practice- Long-term care: This clinical will be eight weeks and held on Thursday and Friday. Clinical will be in the Sturgeon Bay area.

Lifespan Clinical- Varied departments/clinical settings. This clinical will be varied to match a preceptor's schedule and may occur any day of the week, weekends included.

Intro to Clinical Care Management- Med/surg: This clinical will be eight weeks at DCMC in Sturgeon Bay.

Note: Clinical experiences may vary based on site and space availability. Students will be notified in advance of changes.

GRADE REQUIREMENTS

No final grade lower than a "B" is acceptable in the nursing or natural science courses marked with an asterisk. A student must repeat the course with "B" or better final grade to continue in or graduate from this program. If the course is sequential, the successful retake must occur before continuing the sequence.
