- ✓ Clinical Courses: Students are asked preference (day or evening), it is not guaranteed that students will receive their preference
- ✓ Skills Courses: All courses are only available in person
- ✓ The Health Division recommends that all general education coursework and Intro to AD Nursing are completed prior to starting the ADN Bridge program.
- ✓ Students who have graduated from a Practical Nursing program outside of the state of Wisconsin OR completed a PN program in Wisconsin PRIOR to 2005 are required to complete Intro to AD Nursing (10543120).

All courses highlighted in **pink** are clinical courses. Students are typically asked preference of day or evening, but it is not a guarantee that students will receive their preference. Students may need to set time aside the night before or morning of clinical to complete clinical paperwork.

Intermediate Clinical – 7 weeks of med/surg, 4 weeks of psych & 4 weeks off. Clinical could be day or evening. Tuesday/Wednesday Clinical, 6 hours per day.

Advanced Clinical - Med/Surg Clinical. First 7 weeks of the semester all students go to Advanced Clinical (8 hour clinical, 2 days a week) and could be day or evening. Thursday/Friday Clinical.

Transitions - This clinical is a 90 hour precepted clinical. Students work the hours the Nurse Preceptor works and may finish the clinical at different times.

Clinical Times: Clinicals in hospitals are usually 6:45-12:45pm for days and 3-9PM for evenings.
