Bay Area Workforce Development - Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA)

- Program that may be able to offer tuition assistance, along with support services and case management, to adults, youth, and dislocated workers facing barriers to employment
- Eligibility applies to high-demand careers within degree programs that are two years or less in length: Construction, Manufacturing, Healthcare, Information Technology, and Transportation.

Wisconsin Women in Government (WWIG) Undergraduate Scholarship | Deadline: July 3, 2026

Applicants must be a resident of Wisconsin who identifies as female; Have a financial need as determined by the receiving school based on applicant's eligibility for Higher Educational Aids Board (HEAB) eligible grants such as the Federal Pell Grant Program, Wisconsin Grant (WG), or Talent Incentive Program (TIP); Be enrolled, at the time of the application, as a full-time or part-time undergraduate student at any of the eligible institutions; and plan to be enrolled as a full-time or part-time undergraduate student at any of the above institutions for the fall semester. 2027 Manitowoc County Fairest of the Fair Scholarship | Deadline: August 1, 2026

Students interested in agriculture, communication, public service, and public speaking are encouraged to apply. Requirements include: 18 years of age by January 1, 2028, possess a valid driver's license, be a resident of Manitowoc County for one year/a resident of an adjoining county for one year if majority of Fair and/or school activities are held in Manitowoc County. Amy Hunter-Wilson, MD, Scholarship | Deadline: February 1, 2027: Established by Dr. Hunter-Wilson, this scholarship is available to American Indian students who pursue training or advanced education as Doctors of Medicine, nurses, or in a related health field. Award amounts vary, generally \$1,000 or more.

Victor A. Baylon, MD, Scholarship | Deadline: February 1, 2027: As a lasting tribute to Dr. Baylon, a pathologist from Racine, his family and the laboratory staff of All Saints Healthcare System, Inc. created this scholarship for medical students, medical technologists, and clinical laboratory scientists. Scholarships of \$1,000-\$3,000 are limited to residents from Racine or Milwaukee Counties.
