PROGRAM NOTES

GENERAL EDS

All courses noted with a ■ symbol are general education courses and are offered in a variety of different formats. They could be fully online, blended, or in-person. These classes are suggested to be completed prior to program start. Most of these courses are also offered at all regional center locations or campuses.

NURSING CORE THEORY CLASSES

All courses noted with a ■ symbol are only offered in-person in blended format. These classes are only day hours and will be two days per week.

CLINICAL COURSES

All courses noted with a ■ symbol are clinical courses. Students will be placed in a day or evening clinical.

Clinical courses may be six to eight hour shifts and will be two days per week. Students typically need to set time aside to complete clinical paperwork. Clinicals may start at 6:00 A.M. for a dayshift or 2:00 P.M. for an evening shift.

1st Semester - Long Term Care Facility: This clinical will be eight weeks and held on Thursday and Friday. It may be day or evening.

2nd Semester (2nd and 3rd Semester for Spring Start) - Clinic and Med/Surg: The clinic clinical will be day hours and occur Monday through Friday and med/surg will be Tuesday and Wednesday day or evening.

NURSING SKILLS

All courses noted with a ■ symbol are blended. Students are required to practice outside of scheduled class time and are assigned to a check-off time. Check-off times are scheduled outside of class and required of all students.

1st Semester - Nursing Skills is only offered during the day and will be blended. It requires two days per week in person.

NURSING CORE THEORY CLASSES

All courses noted with a ■ symbol are only offered in-person in blended format. These classes are only day hours and will be two days per week.

CLINICAL COURSES

All courses noted with a ■ symbol are clinical courses. Students will be placed in a day or evening clinical.

Clinical courses may be six to eight hour shifts and will be two days per week. Students typically need to set time aside to complete clinical paperwork. Clinicals may start at 6:00 A.M. for a dayshift or 2:00 P.M. for an evening shift.

Semester Two - Long Term Care Facility: This clinical will be eight weeks and held on Thursday and Friday. It may be day or evening.

Semester Three - Clinic Setting: This clinical will be day hours and occur Monday through Friday.

Semester Four - Med/Surg: this clinical will be held on Tuesday and Wednesday. Clinical may be day or evening.

NURSING SKILLS

All courses noted with a ■ symbol are blended. Students are required to practice outside of scheduled class time and are assigned to a check-off time. Check-off times are scheduled outside of class and required of all students.

1st Semester - Nursing Skills is only offered during the day and will be blended. It requires two days per week in person.
