Newcap Steps to Success Program

Participants may be eligible for up to \$2,500 that can be applied to tuition, fees, books, childcare and transportation. Candidates must work at least 20 hours per week; have a household income at or below 150% of the Federal Poverty Rate for their county; and reside in one of the following counties: Brown, Florence, Forest, Langlade, Marinette, Menominee, Oconto, Oneida, Shawano, or Vilas.
