Nursing Assistant Technical Diploma Admissions Guide/Info Packet

The Nursing Assistant program prepares you to successfully pass the state competency exam to become a CNA, Certified Nursing Assistant. For admission into the program, complete the steps listed on this page.

INITIAL ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

Apply to the Nursing Assistant Program <u>nwtc.edu/apply</u> This is your first step. Please submit only one application to the term you plan to take the course at NWTC.	
IF YOU'RE UNDER THE AGE OF 18, email cbc@nwtc.edu the following: "I am a potential Nursing Assistant student, my name is, my NWTC student ID# is, and I am under 18. My date of birth is" *Because you are under 18, you will NOT need to complete the background check portion of the clinical requirements (see below for more information).	
CLINICAL REQUIREMENTS IN VIEWPOINT	COMPLETED
Create Viewpoint account and complete requirements below. Visit viewpointscreening.com and follow the step-by-step instructions: go.nwtc.edu/viewpointhelp. If you're under 18, select 'Nursing Assistant for K12 Students (under age 18 only)' package and then select only the 'Health Portal'. If over 18, select 'Nursing Assistant' package and then 'Background Check + Health Portal'. Note: There is a fee when setting up your Viewpoint account. For Viewpoint questions, use the chat feature when signed in or contact customer support (studentsupport@viewpointscreening.com).	
Complete TB Testing NOT REQUIRED FOR ADMISSION but MUST BE COMPLETED WITHIN 90 DAYS PRIOR TO STARTING CLASS. Report must include dates, times, & results of each test & reading. Upload to Viewpoint.	
Complete the Nursing Technical Standards Form Complete the electronic fillable form in Viewpoint.	
Upload Immunizations Obtain a copy of your immunizations* (Hepatitis B and Covid-19) and upload to Viewpoint. There are two common ways to obtain them: 1. Wisconsin Immunization Registry 2. Contact your primary care provider (or log in to their website or app) *Copy of Covid-19 vaccination card is NOT approved documentation. *Declination forms/options are available within Viewpoint Health Portal for both immunizations.	
When all Viewpoint items (except TB testing) are completed AND approved, email cbc@nwtc.edu so the completion can be verified and checklist items can be marked complete ASAP.	

Once your checklist items have been marked complete and everything is processed, you'll receive communication about program acceptance. This is when you're eligible to enroll into a Nursing Assistant course (NWTC Catalog #30543300).



Tuberculin Skin (TB) Testing Information

What is TB Skin Testing?

TB Skin Testing is done to screen and monitor for Tuberculosis. It is required for all Nursing Assistant students to be eligible to attend clinical.

What are the TB Requirements?

This is not required for admission into the program, but it must be completed within 90 days prior to the start of class.

- A two-step TB skin test (TST) OR a Single Blood Assay Test IGRA (QuantiFERON Gold or T-Spot) are required
 - If there is a positive TB skin test, get a TB screening blood test or chest x-ray. If TB screening blood test is positive, then a clear chest x-ray is required. For those with a history of TB disease or LTBI, an initial post-positive chest x-ray and symptom evaluation is required to rule out TB disease. Follow-up will be determined by the facility.
- Annual renewal required. May complete Annual TB Risk Assessment Questionnaire after initial testing above.

What to Expect for 2-Step Skin Test:

This process takes a minimum of 2 weeks to complete. Results must include patient name, dates of all visits, and full results.

- You will visit the medical provider a total of 4 times
- The first appointment is when you receive your first TB test
- The second appointment (48 hours later) is when the TB results are read
- A minimum of 7 days after your first appointment, you will return for a 2nd TB test
- A fourth appointment (48 hours later) is required for the results of the 2nd TB test (this concludes the 2-step process)

Where to go for TB test:

- Your health care provider or school Nurse Practitioner
- Bellin Health & Concentra Occupational Health
 - Bellin Health + Concentra Occupational Health can provide your physical examination within 48 hours.
 Call 920-430-4560 to find the provider closest to you and schedule an appointment. NOTE: Bellin will not accept insurance for these services. TB Skin Test is \$69 each (two total required).

 - The first time you purchase, you will need to create a new account at checkout
 - Students should order at least one month prior to the start of class
 - Sample uniforms may be available to try on by going to the NWTC Health Sciences Office (HS310) on the Green Bay Campus

WHAT TO EXPECT IN CLASS

Ш	Most Nursing Assistant classes meet 2 or 3 days a week (this will depend on the specific section you choose).
	Classes are offered during the day, in the evening, and on weekends. Weekend classes often fill quickly.
	Class sessions may be 4,5,6 or 8 hours long.
	Most clinical sessions are 8 hours long.
	 Day clinicals are 6am – 2:30pm, evening clinicals are 1-9:30pm
□ is F	The Nursing Assistant program is regulated and monitored by the WI Dept of Health Services. Every student REQUIRED to complete 60 hours of classroom time and 45 hours of clinical time.
	• It is CRITICAL that you attend EVERY session of the class you select. It is very difficult to make up missed time
	Clinical is held in a local Nursing Home – you will provide personal care to Nursing Home Residents.
	There is a lot of reading required. You will read almost the entire textbook in approximately 3 weeks.
	You will have homework after every class session.
	You will take quizzes and exams on a computer. There are four quizzes, four lab session exams, and a final exam.
	You must have an average score of 80% to be eligible to attend clinical.
	You must pass both the classroom and clinical portion of the program to pass the program.
	You will be expected to demonstrate skills while being graded by an instructor.
