Writing Lab Tips and Ideas for Scholarship Application Essays

You will be writing *two* essays in your scholarship application.

Financial Essay – 1 Paragraph

Write a paragraph (called essay) about your financial situation. Consider the following topics and questions as possible ideas to add to your paragraph. These are ideas to get you going but do not all need to be included.

Ideas of things you could include:	Brainstorming space for your thoughts:
 Ways you are paying for college (jobs, loans, scholarships, help from others) 	
 Job(s) you are working, full time or part time 	
 The bills and finances that you pay (car payments, gas, rent, medical bills) Special circumstances or challenges that impact your financial needs 	

Educational Essay – 3 Paragraphs

Write *three* paragraphs for this section of the scholarship application. This will go later in your application.

Ideas for what can go in your paragraphs:	Brainstorming space for your ideas:
Paragraph 1 (Your area of study):	
 Discuss your area of study, how you 	
found out about the field, and why it's	
interesting to you	
 Think about what you hope to learn 	
about in your program at NWTC	
 Consider what's motivating you to 	
graduate from college	
 If you are unsure about your program, 	
what areas of study might you want to	
pursue?	

Paragraph 2 (Your career goals):	
 Potential career paths you might have 	
after completing your	
certificate/program.	
Consider potential jobs that interest you	
 Think about specific jobs, roles, or 	
places you might like to work	
 Talk about your professional goals and 	
how you hope to achieve them	
Positive effects your future line of work	
will have on you and family	
Paragraph 3 (Ways a scholarship would help	
you):	
 Consider how receiving a scholarship 	
would help your life (personally,	
educationally, professionally)	
 Discuss how or why it would be 	
meaningful for you to receive some	
scholarship money
