GENERAL EDS

All courses highlighted in **blue** are general education courses and are offered in a variety of different formats. They could be fully online, blended, or in-person. These classes are suggested to be completed prior to program start. Most of these courses are also offered at all regional center locations or campuses.

NURSING CORE THEORY CLASSES

All courses highlighted in **yellow** are only offered in-person in blended format. These classes are only day hours and will be two days per week.

CLINICAL COURSES

All courses highlighted in **red** are clinical courses. Students will be placed in a day or evening clinical.

Semester One - Long Term Care Facility: This clinical will be eight weeks and held on Thursday and Friday. It may be day or evening.

Semester Two - (Semester Two and Three for Spring Start) - Clinic and Med/Surg: The clinic clinical will be day hours and occur Monday through Friday and med/surg will be Tuesday and Wednesday day or evening.

SKILLS COURSES

All courses highlighted in **green** are in person. Students are required to practice outside of scheduled class time and are assigned to a check-off time. Check-off times are scheduled outside of class and required of all students.

Semester One - Nursing Skills is only offered during the day and will be blended. It requires two days per week in person.

GRADE REQUIREMENTS

No final grade lower than a "B" is acceptable in the nursing or natural science courses marked with an asterisk. A student must repeat the course with "B" or better final grade to continue in or graduate from this program. If the course is sequential, the successful retake must occur before continuing the sequence.
